### Management Discussion of Fund Performance

#### Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund invests primarily in equity securities of Canadian and foreign companies.

The Fund will invest its portfolio such that it generally falls within the Canadian Focused Equity investment strategy category. As such, the Fund generally invests at least 50% and less than 90%, of its equity portfolio in securities domiciled in Canada. The Fund will invest no more than 49% of its assets in foreign securities, with the majority of these foreign securities expected to be domiciled in the United States. In addition, the weighted average market capitalization of the Fund’s equity portfolio is generally considered mid to large capitalization.

The portfolio advisor’s investment approach follows a company focused investment style, seeking companies with unique competitive capabilities, strong management, good growth prospects and a solid financial position. Emphasis is placed on paying reasonable prices for cash flow growth that companies in the portfolio are expected to achieve. The portfolio advisor expects the Fund to generally hold between 20 and 40 equity positions, diversified across business activities and/or sectors.

#### Risk

The Fund is suitable for investors seeking long-term capital appreciation with a tolerance for medium risk. General risks of an investment in the Fund are detailed in the simplified prospectus and include capital gains risk, illiquid investment risk, small capitalization risk, concentration risk, market risk, class risk, interest rate risk, large transaction risk, among others.

There were no significant changes to the investment objectives and strategies that affected the Fund’s overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the Fund and the suitability of the Fund for particular investor’s remains as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus.

#### Results of Operations

The Fund commenced operations in March of 2015. During the year ended December 31, 2018, the Fund issued 8,314 Series A shares, 3,164 Series F shares, 119,553 Series G shares and 1,667 Series H shares; during the year then ended, the Fund redeemed 4,357 Series A shares, 5,094 Series F shares, 76,629 Series G shares and 1,129 Series H shares. As at December 31, 2018, 31,796 Series A shares, 29,646 Series F shares, 190,871 Series G shares and 542 Series H were outstanding. During the year ended December 31, 2018, the Fund realized an accounting loss of \$15,195 from the disposition of securities.

For the year ended December 31, 2018, the Fund earned dividend income of \$35,269. Total expenses before expense reimbursement was \$143,632 comprised mainly of \$26,314 in management fees (calculated daily at an annual rate of 2.0% of the NAV of Series A shares, 1.0% of the NAV of Series F shares, 0.6% of the NAV of Series G shares and 1.6%

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of the NAV of Series H shares), \$50,498 in shareholder recordkeeping and fund accounting fees, \$24,383 in filing fees, \$11,224 in custodial fees and \$9,920 in audit fees.

The net realized loss for the year ended December 31, 2018 was \$15,195 and the net realized gain for the year ended December 31, 2017 was \$650,892. Unrealized depreciation of investments was \$198,949 and \$172,306 for the years ended December 31, 2018 and 2017, respectively.

At December 31, 2018, net assets attributable to holders of redeemable shares for Series A shares was \$327,929 or \$10.31 per share, for Series F shares was \$318,439 or \$10.74 per share, for Series G shares was \$2,274,227 or \$11.91 per share and for Series H shares was \$6,954 or \$12.83 per share.

### Recent Developments

The current environment reflects more the leading edge of the eventual end of the current business cycle. While we believe a recession is unlikely in the coming calendar year, economic growth is beginning to slow and, with it, the ability for companies – even great companies – to grow profit margins will become more difficult as cost pressures mount and pricing power is restrained. The days of artificially-low interest rates are also coming to an end and, as we’ve mentioned in previous notes, tightening corporate credit is becoming a reality versus an expectation.

The bull market that began in March 2009 remains but is certainly on its last legs. It’s difficult to see widespread profit margin expansion as businesses with higher debt leverage and exposure to wage pressures will likely see margins contract. Our best-liked investments remain those with operating leverage which will continue to maintain, and possibly grow, existing margins. Accordingly, at today’s depressed prices, we will prudently increase our positions in select names we feel are best positioned and undervalued.

The decline in Fund performance resulting from the transition to a bear market is more or less in keeping with that done to the overall markets. The Fund invests for the long term of five years or more, so the key consideration is how our slate of businesses will perform as we pass through and emerge from the uncertainty of current market behaviour to the next phase of economic and financial development.

There are a number of pervasive trends that seem very well established and likely to continue to evolve for a prolonged period. These provide disruption and opportunities across many sectors. Digitalization is an over-arching theme supporting and supported by: fifth generation communication networks (more commonly known as 5G); big data collection, storage, and management; social network advertising and marketing; mobility and apps; autonomous driving; and emerging quickly, artificial intelligence.

We are constantly seeking businesses that can benefit from these major trends and, equally importantly, being careful to avoid those that will be the “disruptees”. As we look over the array of businesses in the portfolio, we are satisfied that they measure up well to weather the current turbulence.

### Related Party Transactions

Pursuant to the amended and restated master management agreement, the Manager is entitled to an annual management fee of 2.0% of the net asset value of Series A shares, 1.0% of the net asset value of Series F shares of the Fund, 0.6% of the net asset value of Series G shares of the Fund and 1.6% of the net asset value of Series H shares of the Fund, calculated daily and payable monthly in arrears. For the year ended December 31, 2018, the Fund incurred \$26,314 in management fees of which \$4,621.28 was payable at December 31, 2018.

In order for the Fund to maintain a competitive position with other mutual funds with respect to operating expenses charged to the Fund, AlphaDelta Management Corp. (“AlphaDelta”), an affiliate of Qwest Investment Fund Management Ltd. (the “Manager”), has agreed at its discretion to pay for some of the operating expenses of the Fund. AlphaDelta has absorbed a total of \$73,707 of the operating expenses of the Fund for the year ended December 31, 2018.

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

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### Past Performance


### Year-by-Year Returns
